

# DISCOVER POURING PAINT SUPPLY LIST

## INSTRUCTOR: ROXENE SLOATE

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1. Drop cloth and newspapers
2. Assortment of stretched canvases (if want to work in a series do several the same size).  
1 Large canvas works well too (But must fit in your car after each session - NO STORAGE at school.  
Or can use unstretched canvas, unprimed is preferable.  
You can pour over old canvases you no longer want to keep, or you can use HEAVY watercolor paper, 260lb. or higher
3. Assortment of flow acrylics in colors you like (Golden, Matisse or Lukas are good brands, or can use tempera, inks.
4. Acrylic Glazing Liquid, Gloss if you like shiny or Matte, Golden is a good brand.  
Liquitex Pouring Medium is also great!
5. 2 Spray Bottles, one for water, one for alcohol.
6. Alcohol.
6. Plastic containers with lids (old deli containers work well) To mix and store paints.  
If don't want to keep paint you can bring paper cups or other containers to mix in. To store oil paints, glass works better.
7. 1, 1 1/2 inch brushes from home depot which are very cheap to mix colors  
2 or 3 inch brush
8. Rags and Paper towels (Viva or Bounty are good).

9.\*\*\* Large cardboard box/boxes to get wet paintings home!!!!

OPTIONAL:

If want to do mixed media bring 1-4 small oil paint tubes, black or white would be one of colors, gambol or non-smelling paint thinner to clean brushes and thin oil paint

If want to work with metallic you can buy powder metallics and mix with mineral spirits and medium.

You can also use metallic flow acrylic for a different effect.

Use screening, saran wrap, glitter, or anything you can imagine to pour into paint or add.
