

Multimedia Master Supply List

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Suggested Suppliers, Jerry's Artarama, Deerfield or Jerry's Artarama, West Palm (largest selection of materials). Hands Delray or Michaels Arts and Crafts.

For all Media – supports for Oil and Acrylic. Canvas, illustration board, “Gesso Bord”, “Aqua Bord”, watercolor paper. Any fairly sturdy support of your choice.

IMPORTANT, I suggest the use of a Watercolor pencil* (color of your choice) for preliminary drawing/layout. It is easily removed with a damp paper towel if you wish changes as appose to graphite which can and will bleed through your paint and is difficult to remove to make changes in drawing, or charcoal which corrupts (unless fixed) the paint when painting over.

*You can buy them open stock/separately.

Paper towels, container for turpenoid or water. Sta Wet Palette* for Acrylic, Palette. For oil, glass, disposable palette, paper/foam plates, something sturdy that you can mix your pigments on.

*Masterson Sta-Wet Palette, it will keep you acrylics fluid and usable for days at a time. I use Masterson the “Painters Pal”.

Brushes, the new synthetics are very good and reasonably priced, I use them myself.

Rounds 2 – 4 - 6 – 8

Brights/Flats 6 – 8 – 12.

If you think you will be painting large pieces, you may want to purchase some larger sizes for greater coverage. It might be best to wait for the class to refine your brush selection according to your personal preferences.

Paint – Acrylic ~ Matisse, Winsor & Newton, Golden. These are the top brands, however, there are a number of brands you may choose from and if you already have paint use that. The colors you will need to begin with are as follows, you will add more as you paint according to your personal preferences. The following listing will apply to oil as well as acrylic. The following are suggestions only, different brands sometimes name the same color differently

Large tube of white.

Cadmium (or equivalent) Red

Alizarin Crimson

Cadmium Yellow

Yellow Ochre,

Cerulean Blue Hue,

Burnt Sienna

Burnt Umber

Raw Umber or Vandyke Brown

Sap Green

Viridian Green

Hookers Green

Paynes Gray.

The above also applies to oil painting. You will find numerous very fine paint selections. Winsor & Newton makes a fast drying oil color, “Griffin Alkyd”, and Holbein makes a water-soluble oil called “Duo Aqua Oil”. Both Jerry's and Hands carry these products. An addition, for oil painting, “Liquin”, which can be used as a painting medium and is perfect for glazing. You will also need “Turpanoid” and a container for it.

Watercolor, if you don't already have them, I would suggest you purchase a Yarka or Winsor & Newton full pan set. This is a fine quality set to start with and can easily be taken on outside painting adventures. As you develop your skills you may want to change to tubes, but these pan sets are convenient and contain every pigment you will need.

Be sure to always clean your brushes thoroughly and they will repay you with long life and great art works. I use baby shampoo, dollar store brand is fine, and it keeps them soft, clean and happy.
